

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Picnic Basket For All Seasons

TEACHER: ANN STRITE-KURZ

This class is all about canvas appliqué. Learn the specialized techniques of applying one piece of canvas to a second background canvas to create a raised effect. Several novelty threads are used, including Watercolours, Sparkle Rays, Petite Very Velvet and Kreinik braided metallic.



TECHNIQUE: Canvas Appliqué

LEVEL OF PROFICIENCY: Intermediate and Beyond Canvas.

SIZE: Stretcher Frame Size 12" x 12"

Finished Design Size: 7 1/4" x 7 3/4"

GROUND: 18-count Zweigart mono canvas for both elements

KIT COST: \$46.00

COLOR CHOICES: Three different basket colors will be offered to the students by e-mail once the class lists are received. The Spring basket uses Celadon Watercolours (yellow/green). The Summer option uses Shenandoah Watercolours (blue/pink) and the Fall option uses Paprika (russet).

PREWORK: SOME ADVANCED PREPARATION IS NECESSARY FOR THIS CLASS. Estimated Time: 4-6 hours.

Golden Starflower Box

Designed by Carol Sherman

TEACHER: MYRTIS JUSTIANO

Learn three basic beading techniques as the top and sides of a 3" round paper maché box are embellished with black and gold beadwork. The dimensional flower petals on the box lid are formed with two sizes of beads in peyote stitch.



The lid band is a geometric pattern in square stitch. The open band is stitched with black and gold bugle beads in a variation of right angle stitch. An easy box lining will be completed in class.

TECHNIQUE: Beading in peyote, square and a variation of right angle stitches

LEVEL OF PROFICIENCY: Intermediate. No pre-work required.

KIT COST: \$46.00 includes round paper maché box; felt; threads; needles; beads; instruction booklet with complete graphs and finishing instructions.

Students provide: paper scissors; giant size black permanent marker; pen or pencil; beading dish or a velux "placemat"; light/magnifier.

A Spot in Michigan: A Stitcher's Pocket & Fittings



TEACHER: SHERRI JONES - PATRICK'S WOODS

Michigan's rich history and natural beauty inspire the motifs for a stitcher's pocket and fittings, which celebrate Michigan's fabulous abundance of picnic 'spots'!

TECHNIQUE: Stitches include tent, florentine, plaited gobelin, long arm cross, smryna cross, tied oblong cross, and stem stitch.

LEVEL OF PROFICIENCY: Intermediate

SIZE: Approx. 4 1/2" w x 13 1/2", Closed measures approx. 5 1/2" square.

GROUND: 30 count natural linen

KIT COST: \$95.00

Class time will emphasize hand finishing instruction. Kit includes linen, silk, wool felt, 2 lining fabrics, grosgrain ribbon, vintage button, interfacing and tapestry needle. Please bring to class dressmaker's shears, ruler, straight pins, sharp needle and basic sewing supplies.

FACULTY

ANN STRITE-KURZ is a NAN certified teacher who has been an active designer and traveling teacher for twenty-eight years. She earned a Master Craftsman in Canvas Embroidery from EGA in 1980 and wrote three group correspondence courses for EGA. She specializes in innovative composite patterns and has published five books on different pattern styles. The latest one on *Diaper Patterns* was released in 2007 and a full-color bound edition of *Canvas Appliqué* was published in 2009.

MYRTIS JUSTIANO, a retired kindergarten teacher, is a 30+ year member of the Elkhart EGA, and a charter member of both the Chicago and Hoosier Heartland ANGs. She has served on the GLR board for the past 16 years. Myrtis has taught many classes at local meetings and was the GLR Touring Teacher in 2002 teaching Genny Morrow designs to 17 chapters. She proofs designs for some national teachers.

SHERRI JONES began designing under the trade name of Patrick's Woods 17 years ago, and has been teaching for 14 years. She enjoys researching and collecting textile-related souvenirs and novelties of the 18th and 19th centuries. Most often, her designs are an interpretation of the old while preserving the sentiment of the era and the quality of hand construction. She also enjoys researching forgotten techniques (such as lucet cording and finger crochet) and incorporates these techniques into her designs for added interest and challenge.

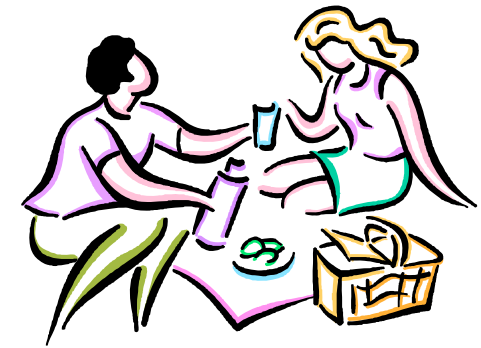
